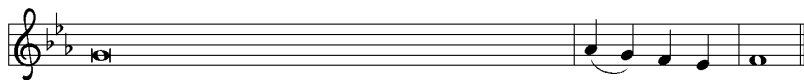

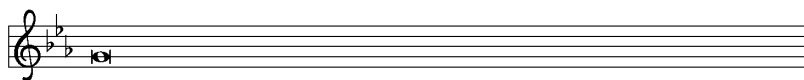

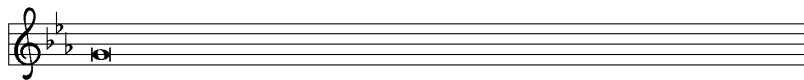

First Reading: Genesis 1:1-5

¹In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, ²the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. ³Then God said, “Let there be light”; and there was light. ⁴And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day. The Word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God.**

Second Reading: Acts 19:1-7

¹While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. ²He said to them, “Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?” They replied, “No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit.” ³Then he said, “Into what then were you baptized?” They answered, “Into John’s baptism.” ⁴Paul said, “John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus.” ⁵On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ⁶When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied—⁷altogether there were about twelve of them. 





THE BENEVOLENCE OF THE MONTH for January is Advocates for the Homeless of Upper Bucks (Code Blue). Most of us are fortunate to have shelter, warmth, and food during the cold months of winter. For those who do not have those primary needs of comfort, hope, and survival, there are Code Blue Shelters. These shelters typically open when the temperature goes below 20 degrees Fahrenheit. They will also stay open during prolonged periods of ice and snow. Money is needed for food, bus tokens to get guests to and from the shelter, and for bedding items and cleaning. The AHTN program also sends vans to various locations to pick up homeless people.
